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## HD Radio – by Jim Sorenson

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I installed an aftermarket HD Radio unit in my car a few months ago here are the positives of HD Radio for me:

1. HD Radio is a digital signal and the sound quality is definitely better than terrestrial radio.
2. HD Radio stations may have multiple stations (sub-channels). Assume that your favorite radio station is 99.3 on the dial. Well, if you listen to terrestrial radio, you only get programming from 99.3 on your radio. If that same station has an HD signal, the terrestrial channel would also be broadcast on HD1 99.3, but with better sound quality, etc. The station may also broadcast programming material on sub-channels HD2 99.3, HD3 99.3, etc. and those channels are most likely different programming formats. HD1 99.3 might be hard rock, HD2 99.3 might be classic rock, HD3 99.3 might be talk radio, etc.
3. The HD Radio digital signal contains information about the artist, song, etc., so that while a song is playing, you push a button on the headunit to display the song title, artist, etc.



I would absolutely do it all over again and if you have been on the fence about it, I am giving it my thumbs up.

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Everyone had a great time at the Cornhole Tourney in August; THANK YOU's go out to both Joe and Jane Zanghi for once again putting everything together to make this event such a good time. My wife Diana and I played

August expenses totaled \$7,445.68 which includes a deposit to reserves of \$984.50. A few notable expenses included \$747.25 for fertilizer for the lawns and a \$500 fee for required back flow checks on our irrigation system. Two other large expenditures included \$1,500 for management company fees and approximately \$3,000 for landscaping. We closed August with \$80,160.52 in our checking account (up from \$68,300.95 in July) but found Reserves down to \$249,172.99 from \$266,311.61 as we transferred monies from Shoreline Reserves to Checking to pay for the work performed this past Spring on the beach and stone break walls.



Comparing prior year's expenses against projected ones for the remaining months of this year, I estimate we should finish the year right on budget and slightly in the black.
